Statement of Need

The aging of America is placing an ever-increasing strain on the health care system. Twelve percent of the US population is over 65 now, and that figure will climb to twenty percent by 2030. Older patients already account for over a third of the nation's in-patient surgical procedures. According to a recent Institute of Medicine report, virtually every specialty lacks enough adequately trained personnel to appropriately care for this "silver tsunami". Anesthesiologists should be familiar with how the needs of older patients differ from those of younger patients. The goal of this meeting is to improve the anesthesiologist's understanding of how aging alters not only anesthetic care, but perioperative complications, and recovery from the stress of orthopaedic surgery.

Target Audience

Anesthesiologists, orthopaedic surgeons, primary care physicians, residents, fellows and CRNAs

Objectives

HSS activities are intended to improve the quality of patient care and safety. At the conclusion of the course, the participant should be able to:

- Describe how the aging process increases the risks of most perioperative complications and alters the response to anesthesia
- Determine when the use of regional anesthesia and other anesthetic choices may or may not help reduce the incidence and severity of many complications
- Summarize how organized programs of care may reduce common complications in older patients suffering from hip fractures
- Recognize and appraise postoperative patient conditions more efficiently
